

## The Covenants Part 2

### Topics discussed

- In this teaching, Carl discusses the relationship between God and the Jews in the Mosaic covenant. He clarifies that God has not abandoned or divorced the Jews. The Jews are still under the Mosaic covenant unless they have received Christ and come under the new covenant. Carl also explains the difference between the mosaic law for Jews and the law of conscience for Gentiles. They argue that both Jews and Gentiles needed a savior and sacrifice, fulfilled in Christ and the new covenant. The new covenant extends from the Abrahamic covenant and brings greater blessings and a new nature. The law and its ordinances are part of the covenant, determining whether obedience leads to blessings or disobedience leads to curses. The curses serve to remove people who forsake God. The audience is encouraged to examine their lives to see if they experience blessings or curses based on their obedience to the law. The transcript concludes that God's moral standards remain the same, and Christ fulfills the law. The meeting also mentions the upcoming discussion on the Passover feast and the new covenant.

### Study guide questions

- Conduct further research on the concept of the old covenant and its relationship to the mosaic covenant.

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- Seek clarification on the connection between the mosaic covenant and modern ceremonies of marriage.

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- Examine the implications of breaking the mosaic covenant for Jews who have not received Christ and come under a new covenant.

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- Investigate the idea of Christians selectively choosing which aspects of the law to follow and the potential consequences.

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- Reflect on the blessings and curses associated with obeying or disobeying the covenant and examine personal life for signs of these blessings or curses.

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
